"Are our children learning?" is now a catch question since the launch of the East African annual learning assessment report in the middle of 2011. Now we are launching a country report reflecting national data. Being asked to speak at the launch of this report was a bit of a challenge to me as I started to ask myself questions and try to remember my childhood. Was I learning when I was in Kigoma Primary School?

When I was in standard five, I was elected chairperson of Elimu ya Kujitegemea (EK) in my school. EK managed school projects like the school garden and as the chairperson I was a signatory to the EK school bank account. Without my signature, the headmaster would not withdraw money from this account, so I learnt about banking and basic financial management at a very young age. This was during the times when our education system was guided by a philosophy, "Education for Self-reliance". Before, the philosophy was Education for Liberation, and I don't remember when this country stopped this practice. I don't know what our education philosophy is now!

Yes, I was learning, and I am sure my colleagues were learning as well. There was no Uwezo then to assess us, but even if there had been the assessment wouldn't have found 3 out of 10 standard three pupils who couldn't have read a standard two basic story, wouldn't have found 3 out of 10 pupils who couldn't do very basic mathematics as we used to sing tables in classes, wouldn't have found 20% of teachers being absent as discipline was high amongst teachers and inspectors were very effective. Study paints grim picture: Tanzanian lower primary kids not learning at all

Rapporten vækker stor opmærksomhed og debat i flere aviser.

A new study paints a grim picture of literacy and numeracy skills in Tanzanian schools.

The study, released last week by Uwezo Tanzania and Twaweza East Africa, shows that children in primary schools are not learning, a problem that could be filtering up to other levels and weakening Tanzania's skills base.



Only four out of 10 pupils in Standard 7 in the country can read and understand simple paragraphs in English and Kiswahili and perform the basic arithmetic expected of a Standard 2 pupil, according to the study.

Rural children have it particularly bad as urban children in



Standard 3 are twice as likely to have gained Standard 2 level skills as their rural counterparts.

The World Bank says the poor quality of education is seriously hampering Tanzania's competitiveness in the region. [Læs videre her](#)

Put more emphasis on science and technology – Msuya

Retired prime minister Cleopa Msuya, has said Tanzania has to invest more in science and technology as it is the only way in which she can improve her economy.



Speaking during the tenth graduation ceremony of St Mary Goreti Secondary School in Moshi, he said that globalisation and science and technology will move Tanzania's economy forward.

He urged students and the rest of the countrymen to study science related subjects more because they are the ones leading the world we live in.

Msuya also said the education sector has improved in the 50 years of the independence of Tanganyika, compared to the colonial past when there were few graduates.

The improvement in education is a result of the good foundation of peace and leadership laid down by the late Father of the Nation Mwalimu Julius Nyerere.
